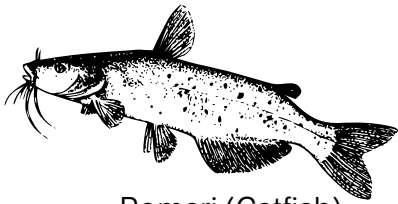
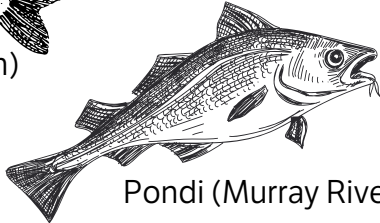


Make a Paper Yuki

A yuki is a canoe made by First Nations people from a single sheet of bark, usually cut from a river red gum tree.



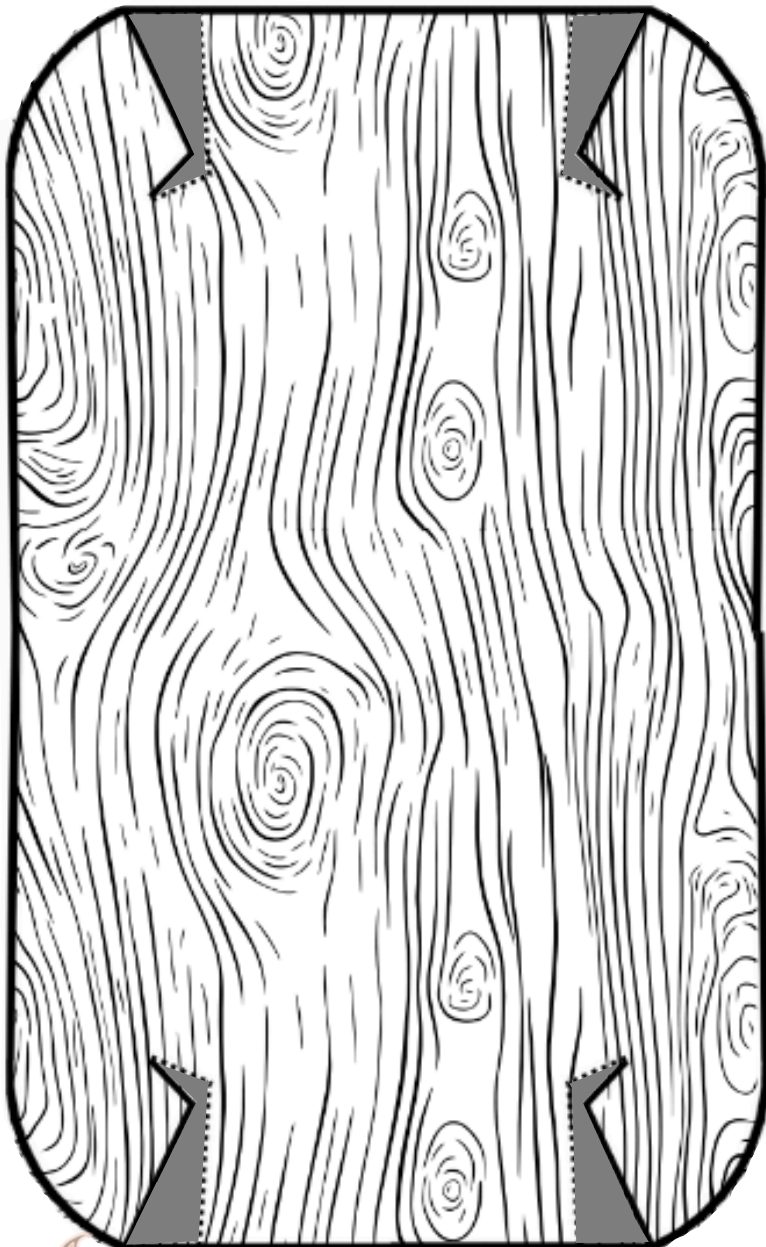
Pomeri (Catfish)

Kanmeri (Coorong Mullet)

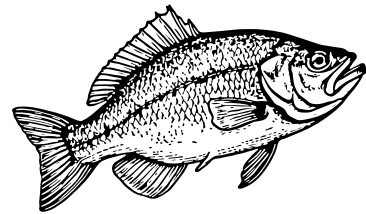


Materials:



- coloured pencils
- glue
- scissors

1. Colour in your yuki and fish.
2. Cut out the fish and cut along the solid lines of your yuki (including the L-shapes).
3. Put glue on the grey areas.
4. Slide the L-shape along so it lines up with the dotted line. Press down to stick. (This should make the sides of the yuki stick up a little).
5. Do you think your yuki can float? Will it hold fish? Why/why not? Once it's dry, fill a sink with water and test it out!
6. If you have access to natural materials, try making a yuki with pieces of bark or other things you can find in nature.
