# **Description**

Learners will be encouraged to closely examine the exhibition objects to explore the complexity of perspectives, and their own relationship to the object. Learners can use the worksheet to explore the stories behind the objects, people, and perspectives. Please adapt these guides to suit the needs of your learners.

This lesson can be used in conjunction with Lesson 1: Holden and South Australia, and Lesson 2: Responding to Oral Histories. This lesson can also be used as a stand alone with the digital exhibition, or on an in-person excursion.

# **Slide 4: Important Words**

Clarify the learner's understanding of the keywords that will be used during the lesson.



# Slide 5-6: Special Objects

Ask learners to reflect on their own special objects and prompt thinking about what kinds of qualities make their object special to them. Highlight the idea that an object can hold significance to different people for different reasons.

#### Slide 7-8: Prior Knowledge & Context

Introduce Holden's history, significance, and closure to South Australia using prior knowledge, and the short video.

Note: If you and your learners completed "Lesson 1: Holden and South Australia" you may wish to recap and summarise in less detail.

#### Slide 9: Parts, Perspectives, and Me

Explain how to complete, "Parts, Perspectives, and Me" task. Learners can complete this individually, in pairs, or object by object as a class. You may like to use small groups or the jigsaw method. This worksheet is also suitable for excursion useage.

# Slide 10-17: People and Objects

These slide can be used to provide background into the individuals behind the oral histories in Lesson 2, or as an intorduction to the owners of the objects. Each slide includes images of the objects and information about their origins.


