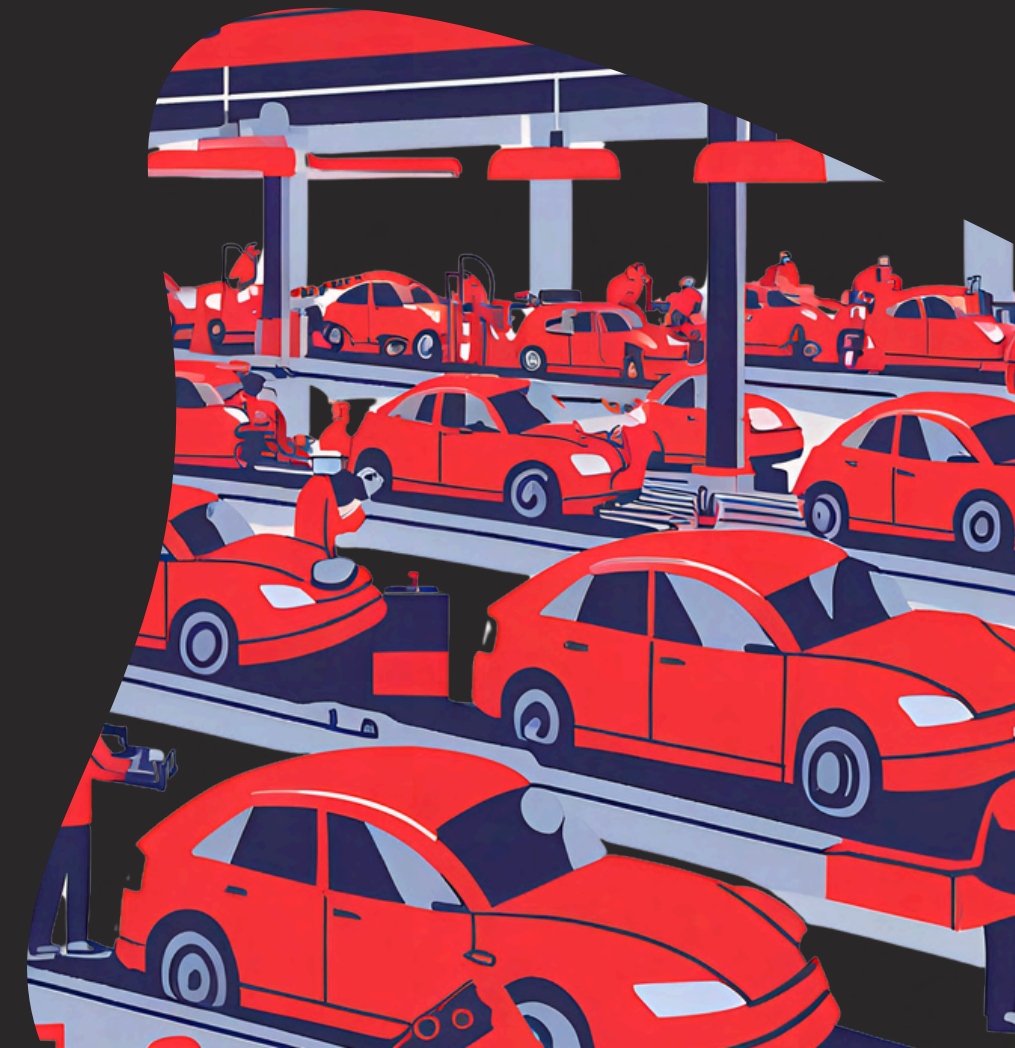

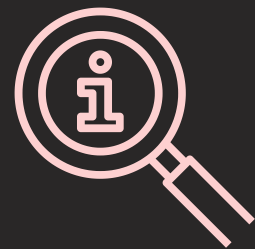


In this lesson, we will...

Exercises

Synonyms:

Antonyms:

Make a list of words that mean the opposite of your word.



Pictionary:

Draw a picture that explains the meaning of your word. You may like to add labels to help others understand.



Definitions:

Write a definition of what you think the word means using words your classmates would understand.



Share your word and definition with the class. Pin/stick the word on the word wall.

Sentences:

Write a sentence that features your word.

Can you write your sentence in a way that explains the meaning of your word to others?



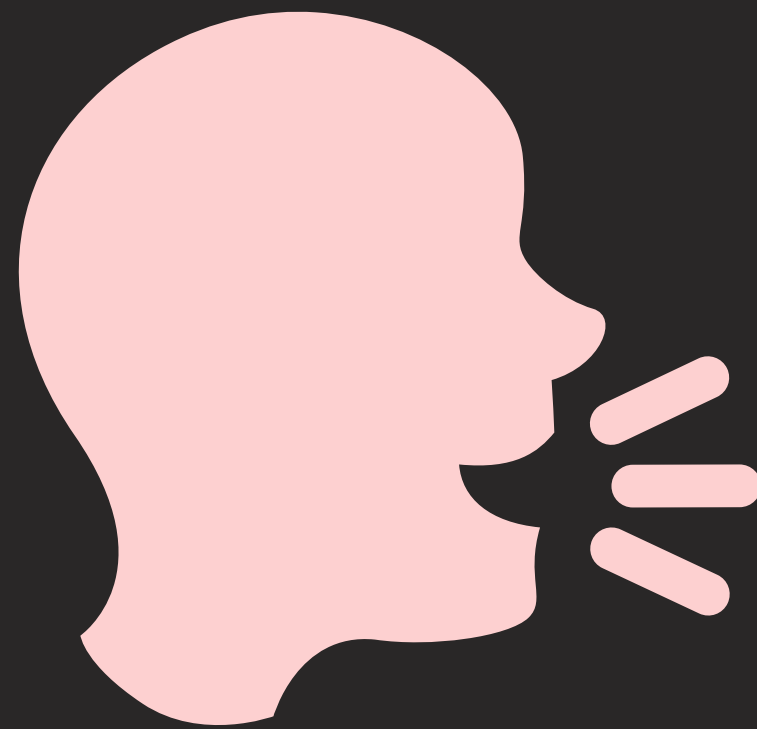
Acrostic Poem:

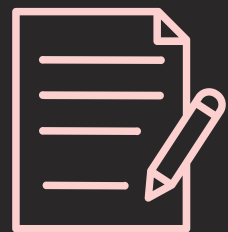
