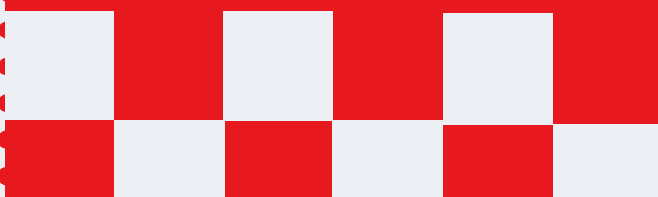
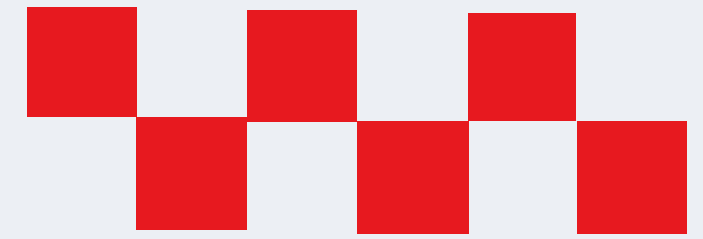

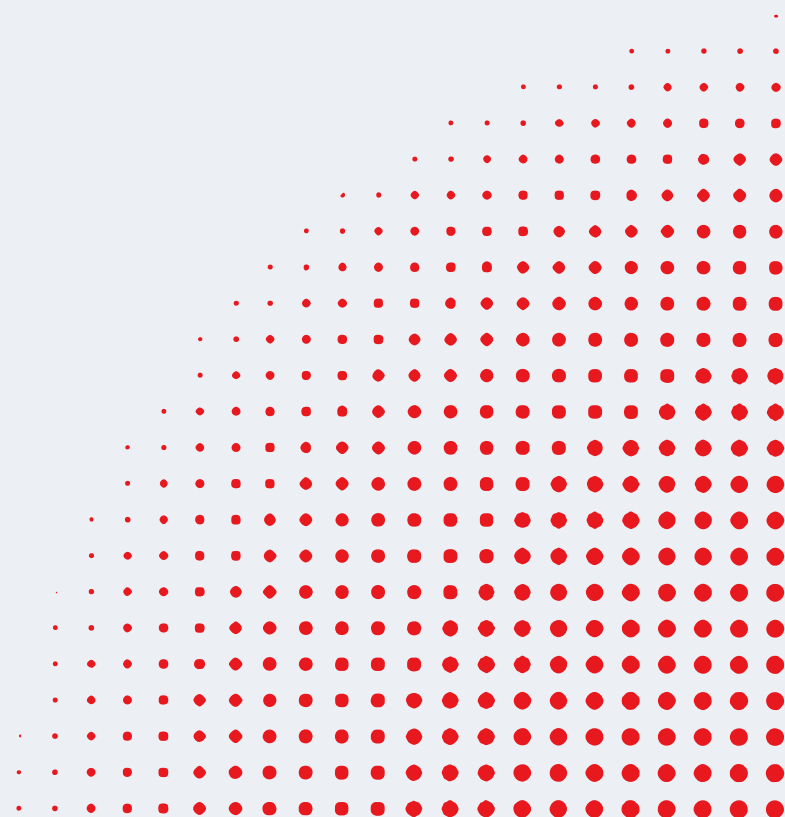
The Galleries

The museum has three core galleries full of motoring treasures and stories.

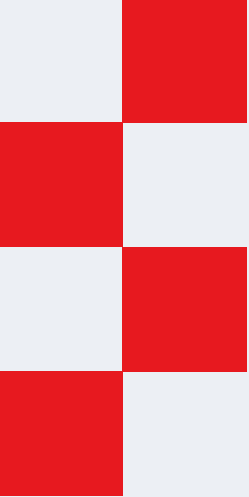


EXPECTATIONS

The Museum is open to the public. All visitors should be respectful of others visiting the museum.

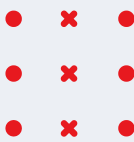


- The museum is very big, with lots of galleries. Be sure to stick with your group so as to not get lost.

THE CAR: UNDER THE HOOD



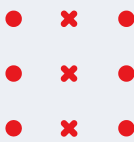
Cars have many components under the hood, including engines, batteries, cooling systems and fluid reservoirs. The internal design can vary greatly between diesel, petrol, hybrid and electric.

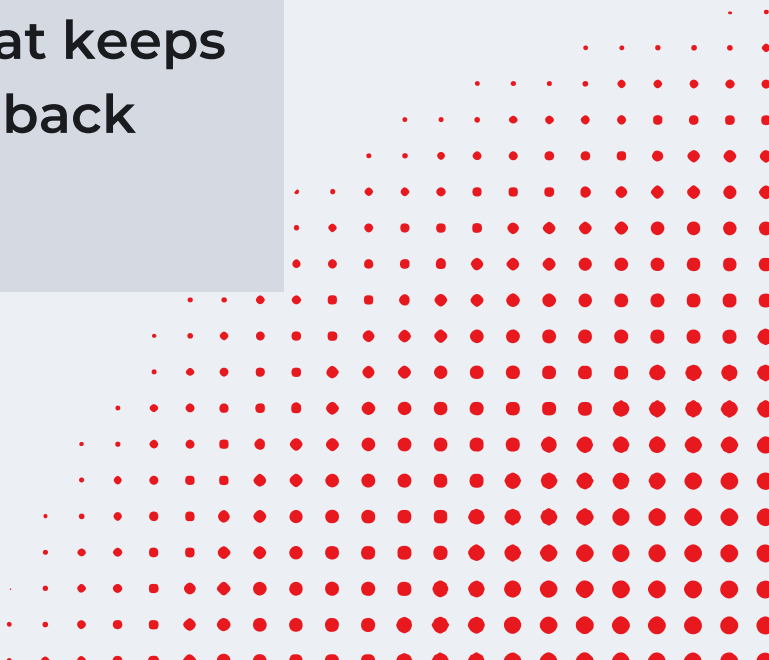

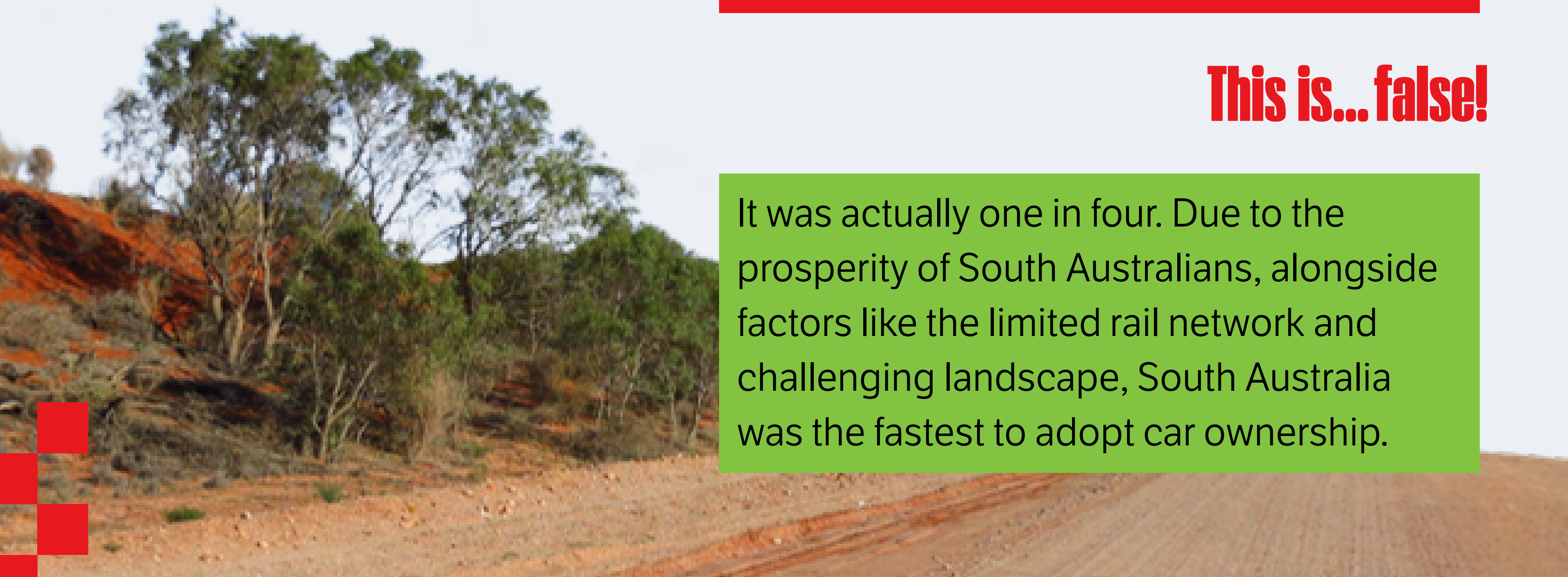

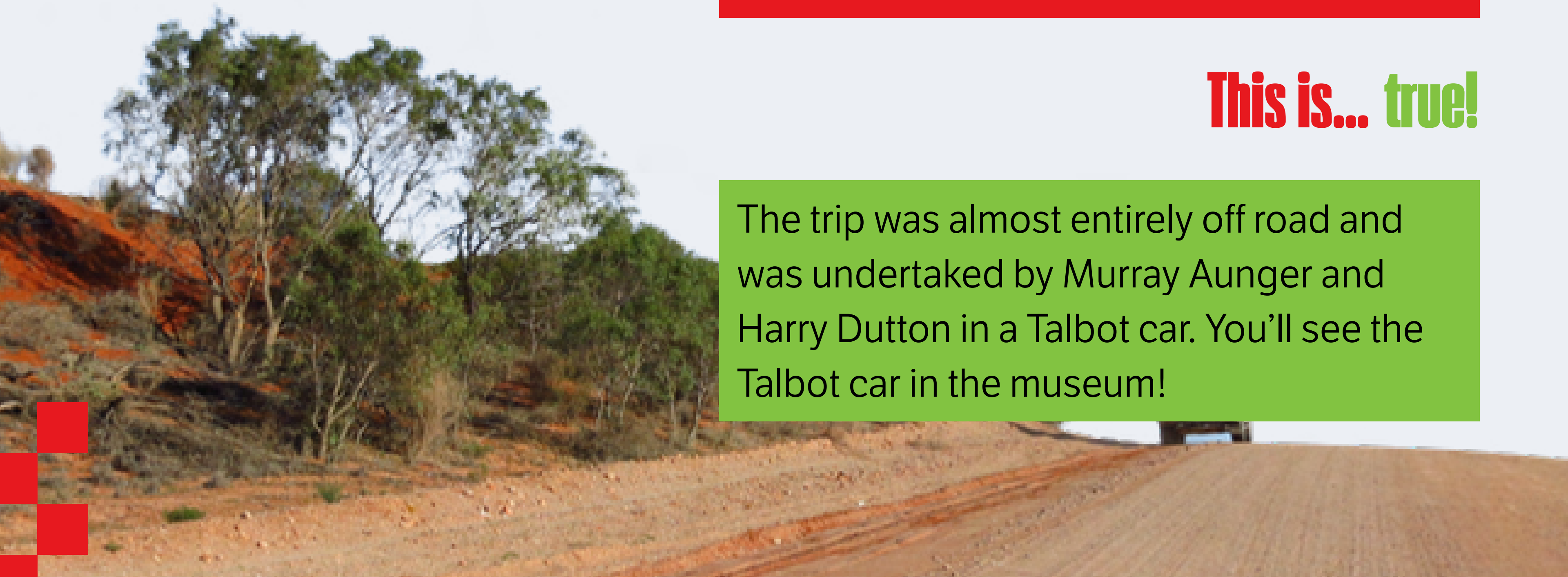

At 7,688,287 km², Australia is the sixth largest country in the world. Its cities are connected internally with many highways, freeways and roads. The Highway 1 loop circles the island, and has been completed in less than one week!

However, that infrastructure hasn't always been there, and cars are a relatively recent development in our country's history.

When British colonisers established settlements in Sydney, and later in Hobart, Brisbane and beyond, there were no European-style roads, but there were well-established Aboriginal pathways and trade routes. Some of these influenced the routes of colonial roads.
